Curriculum

At present, Corran College offers five programmes:

Junior Certificate, Junior Certificate Schools Programme, Leaving Certificate, Leaving Certificate Vocational Programme and Leaving Certificate Applied.

Junior Cycle

The new Junior Cycle features newly developed subjects and short courses, a focus on key skills, and new approaches to assessment and reporting. The rational underpinning this programme is to enable learners to achieve their full potential and contribute to Ireland's economic, social and cultural development. We have fully updated our curriculum at Junior Cycle. During second and third year, students complete a number of Classroom-Based Assessments in their chosen subjects. Students study 10 subjects for their Junior Cycle. They also complete 400hrs of Wellbeing within the 3 year programme, this includes Physical education, Civic, Social and Political Education(CSPE) and Social, Personal and Health Education (SPHE).

The following subjects are available at Junior Cycle:

Junior Certificate Schools Programme (JCSP)

All Junior Certificate students avail of additional funding and initiatives which focus on enhancing literacy and numeracy through the JCSP programme. All our students receive a portfolio of achievement from the Department of Education and Science at the end of third year, in recognition of participation in JCSP. This is in addition to completion of the Junior Certificate examinations.





Leaving Certificate & Leaving Certificate Vocational Programme

Students complete a two year Senior Cycle programme. Core academic subjects studied by all students are Irish, English and Maths.

Students pick four additional subjects from the following:

Biology	Construction Studies	Art, Craft & Design	Design & Communication Graphics
Business / Accounting	Home Economics	French	Engineering

Non-Academic compulsory subjects at senior cycle are Physical Education, Religion/Wellbeing and Career Guidance.

Leaving Certificate Vocational Programme

The LCVP programme is designed to give a strong vocational dimension to the Leaving Certificate. Students choosing this route study the above subjects with an additional subject called Link Modules. Students complete a detailed portfolio of work and a work experience module. Points awarded for this subject are used to calculate CAO points for admission to university.





Leaving Certificate Applied

LCA is a two year programme for students who wish to follow a more practical or vocational oriented programme. It is also suited to students who wish to go straight into the workforce. In order to meet third level entry requirements, LCA students must first complete a QQI Level 5 PLC course. One day each week is spent on Work Experience. Students try out a minimum of four different work placements over two years. This assists students with their career choice. Students must maintain a 90% attendance rate during both years of LCA.

Examinations

Students complete a detailed task and are interviewed at the end of each module by examiners from the State Examinations Commissions. Credits are awarded for each project and interview. Credits are awarded by teachers for completion of coursework during the academic year. Terminal examinations are held in June of second year.




Technology in Education

Students and staff have embraced ICT in every subject. We acknowledge the importance of *"anytime, anywhere"* learning and the opportunities for self-directed and more personalised learning. Wi-Fi infrastructure has been extensively updated to allow instant access in all areas of the school. The classrooms in Corran College have high quality data projectors, visualisers and apple tv to allow for seamless integration with the teachers device during a lesson. Our mobile trolley of laptops allows any classroom to convert to a computer room when needed.



All students in Corran College are provided with access to the full suite of Microsoft packages through Office 365. This allows them to download the Microsoft suite of packages to five different personal devices. One of the main benefits of office 365, is that it is a cloud-based package. This allows all our students to work remotely. Microsoft teams and associated apps are used in our school to provided the facility for online lessons and hybrid or blended learning if needs be.

Learning Support

Students are monitored for additional support through testing administered in school and reports furnished from other professionals. Corran College has a long history of providing excellent supports to maximise student potential.

Book Rental

Book rental is available to all students. A deposit of \in 50 is paid in first year with a rental of \in 50 each year thereafter.

Educational Monitoring

Cognitive Ability Testing is carried out each year in conjunction with Reading Ability Tests. The results indicate student progress and aptitude.

Career Guidance

Career Guidance is offered as a weekly subject to Leaving Certificate and LCA students. Our Guidance Counsellor is available for one-to-one sessions as required.

Access Programme

In conjunction with St. Angela's College, Sligo, students of Corran College receive additional academic support, campus visits, revision courses, mentoring and study skills seminars. All are provided free of charge from St. Angela's College in association with NUIG.

Gaeltacht Scholarships

Mayo, Sligo and Leitrim ETB award two full Gaeltacht scholarships annually to students of Corran College. There is great competition for the coveted places each year. Scholarships are awarded to students who are successful at interview.





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Pastoral Care

Home School Community Liaison

Our HSCL officer meets with parents of all first year students during the first term of school. HSCL encourages active cooperation and collaboration between home, school and relevant professional and community agencies. The HSCL officer facilitates courses for parents to support their children in education, such as parenting teens, project maths for parents, paired reading, literacy and numeracy support.

School Completion

Corran College is fortunate to have the services of a School Completion worker. The service mentors students who are experiencing challenges in school, while helping the student to reach their full academic potential.

Pastoral Care Team

This team is made up of Principal, Deputy Principal, Tutors, HSCL, Guidance Counsellor and a School Completion worker. The team supports the social, emotional, personal and behavioural needs of the student.

Guidance

The school offers a guidance facility for students. It is provided in several ways such as personal counselling that focuses on good mental health and well-being.

Student Voice

The Student Council is composed of a representative sample of students from each school year. They work tirelessly to raise money for deserving charities, contribute to school policy and school improvement and represent the voice of the student in the school.

Communication with Parents

Corran College prides itself on the excellent links we have established with parents. Open channels of communication are regularly used from the student journal, phone call contact, SMS messaging, email and utilising our VS Ware communication platform. Our new website at www. corrancollege.com provides up to date news, school information and supportive information for our parents. We also have a very active Facebook page with regular updates showing the day to day happenings in our school

Parents Association

Corran College has an active Parents Association which supports the school in policy development, fundraising and school development. New parents are encouraged to join and become active members, helping to build effective partnership between home and school.







Homework

Homework is an essential component of the learning process. It is important that the parent takes an active part in the homework process. Students record homework in their journal during every class throughout the school day. This record assists the student's organisation of their homework routine. Parents are asked to check the school journal each evening and to sign it weekly. It is an important two-way communication tool for teachers and parents. Year heads and class tutors also check the school journal at least once a week.

It is important that students have a quiet place to study each evening and that good study habits are developed from the beginning of first year.

Students have access to our digital platform Office 365, this allows them to submit their homework assignments digitally over Microsoft teams and recieved feedback directly from their teacher.

Uniform

The official school uniform for boys and girls is as follows:-

- Blue V neck jumper with a sky blue trim.
- Sky blue shirt or blouse.
- Navy trousers.
- Black shoes or black runners.

The PE Uniform can be worn to school on days that students have PE classes or at the discretion of the Principal.

The PE uniform is:

- A royal blue crested zip top.
- Navy crested tracksuit bottoms.
- White polo shirt.

Code of Positive Behaviour

We have introduced a new Code of Positive Behaviour in September 2020. This structured system is rooted in the principles of mutual respect, courtesy, justice, the common good and health and safety. In turn this provides a firm, fair, safe learning environment in which students can reach their true potential. Our nine step "ladder of referral" based system provides interventions to help students correct any misbehaviour and promotes positive and restorative practices. We instil an emphasis on respect for school property and that of others. Bullying of any description is dealt with promptly in accordance with our Anti-Bullying Policy.
